basic types. The one is the herbaceous. These die back each year in spring to grow a small bush. They may be quite heavy, often causing the plant to droop. This is remedied by putting in a support. The second type is the tree peony that has a woody stem. It is important to plant it in a place where the soil is rich and it is not too dry. The third type is the intersectional or ltoh peonies which are actually crosses between herbaceous and tree types. Like the regular herbaceous types, ltoh peonies die back to the ground each year. However, the stems tend to be larger and sturdier, so the flowers are less likely to flop. The flowers are also larger, similar in size to the tree peonies.

Peonies bloom in white and warm colors, ranging from pink to deep red and burgundy. Tree and ltoh peonies also have yellow and apricot blooms. Many blooms are bi-color or may include several shades. Blooms may be single, semi-double or double. Some sport ruffled petals and others form bowls, often with layers of different-colored petals. All of the blooms are attractive and most have great scent.

some tree peonies as tall as eight feet. Tree peonies are usually grafted onto the roots of herbaceous plants and a major problem is that an injury may cause the rootstock to send up herbaceous growth that may, in time, out-compete the tree peony. If you see such growth, the safest thing to do is to cut it off as quickly as possible.

The third type is the newest development. Intersectional or ltoh peonies are actually crosses between herbaceous and tree types. Like the regular herbaceous types, ltoh peonies die back to the ground each year. However, the stems tend to be larger and sturdier, so the flowers are less likely to flop. Last year, I saw a fern-leaved peony at a botanical garden. The foliage was indeed dissected and looked like a fern. It had deep red blooms. That cultivar is on my wish-list.

Peonies have few problems. When summers are wet, the foliage may suffer from fungal diseases, usually black spot. It may be unsightly, but it is rarely fatal to the plant. When disease

Net Literacy donates computers

Who would have dreamed that an organization founded in 2003 by a middle school student, Daniel Kent, in Carmel, would positively affect our community in 2016? Five re-purposed computers have replaced malfunctioning computers at Melton Public Library. These computers have been generously donated to our library through an organization called Net Literacy.

Born out of a desire to bridge the digital divide between the younger tech-savvy generation and the older technologically challenged, Net Literacy is a world renowned organization that serves digital users across the age spectrum.

Bridging this divide begins with a computer equipped with a good operating system. Net Literacy's re-purposed computers are found throughout Indiana and four other states. This component of Net Literacy is called "Computer Connects." A partnership with Microsoft and Tech Soup made it possible to re-purpose more than 34,000 computers, placing them free of charge in independent living facilities, schools, libraries, faith-

based organizations and other non-profits.

The "Community Connects" component of Net Literacy has built hundreds of computer labs to increase computer access to the under-served by providing computers to HUD (Department of Housing and Urban Development) and Section 8 housing and families without a computer in the home.

"Senior Connects," another component, promotes senior citizen computer literacy through computer donations and individualized computer training.

One more cog in the works of this organization is the "Safe Connects," which educates students about internet safety.

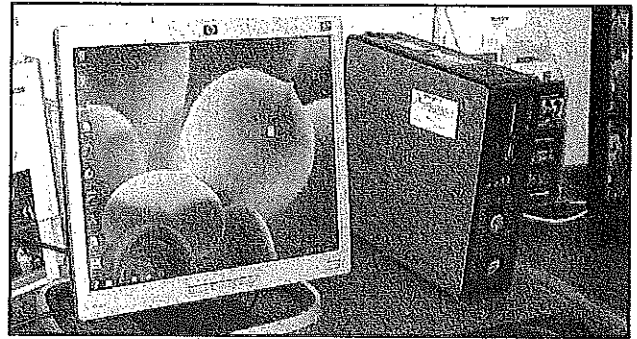
Public Service Announcements that educate and promote internet safety, created by the students, run

on cable television systems and broadcast stations, and three 30-minute television videos have been designed and produced by student volunteers.

Perhaps just as noteworthy as the service provided by Net Literacy is the makeup of this unique organization. This organization is a "student empowered" non-profit group comprised of 1,000 student volunteers who make up 50 percent of the board of directors and conduct all of the day-to-day volunteering, planning and grant writing.

Kent once said, "while one person can make a difference, at Net Literacy, together we can change the world."
